Rebecca Greenberg is a bioethicist and registered nurse with extensive training and experience in health care ethics and nursing. She has a Bachelor of Arts (psychology) from the University of Manitoba, and a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from the University of Toronto, and PhD (bioethics) from the University of Toronto. She has completed a 1 year ethics internship at Baycrest Centre where she focused on ethical issues in geriatrics. Rebecca has a post-doctorate fellowship in Clinical and Organizational Ethics at the University of Toronto Joint Centre for Bioethics. Prior to entering the field of ethics Rebecca practiced as a registered nurse in general medicine at Mount Sinai Hospital in Toronto, Ontario.

Previously, she worked as a bioethicist at the Centre for Clinical Ethics (a shared service of Providence Healthcare, St. Joseph's Health Centre and St. Michael's Hospital). In this role she worked with marginalized and underprivileged populations. She is currently a bioethicist at the Hospital for Sick Children where she provides clinical and organizational ethics consultation to staff, family, patients, volunteers and trainees.

Rebecca excels in education providing lectures, seminars, and case discussions in both the hospital and university setting. Rebecca is a co-course director of "Foundations of Bioethics 2" in the Master's of Health Science in Bioethics Program at the University of Toronto Joint Centre for Bioethics. She holds a status-only Assistant Professor appointment with the University of Toronto's Faculty of Medicine in the Department of Family and Community Medicine. Dr. Greenberg has sat on many varied ethics related committees in health care from pandemic planning committees, ethics committees, use of restraints to research ethics boards.

Over the years Rebecca has provided ethics consulting services to organizations such as Trillium Gift of Life and The Interagency Advisory Panel on Research Ethics. She currently serves as the Vice-Chair of Veritas Institutional Research Ethics Board and acts as an ethics consultant to Children's Aid Services Toronto and as part of EthicScan's team providing professional ethical distress advisory services to Correctional Services Canada.

Rebecca has published in the field of ethics and speaks at conferences both nationally and internationally. Her main research interests include clinical ethics, transplant ethics, priority setting and public engagement.
